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FABRIC REQUIREMENTS & CUTTING LIST

cut 2 at 3.5" x 3.5"
cut 2 at 6.5" x 3.5"
cut 4 of Template B

cut 3 at 6.5" x 6.5"

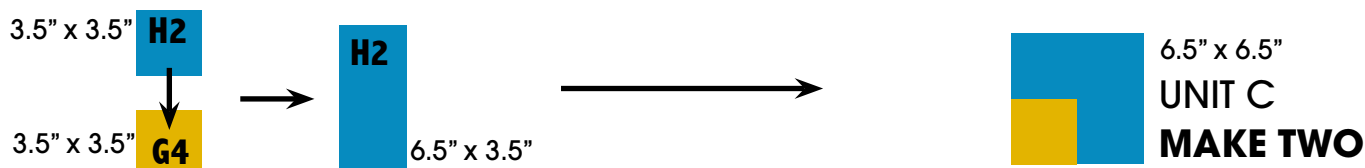

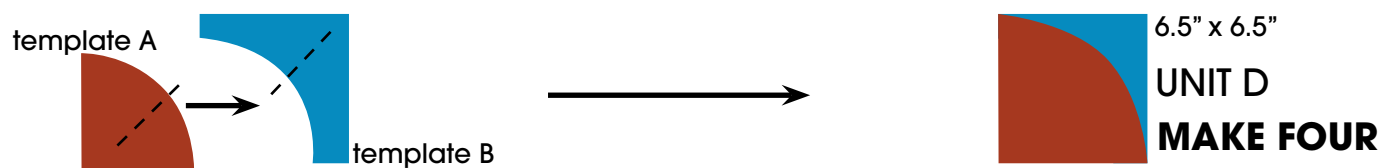

ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

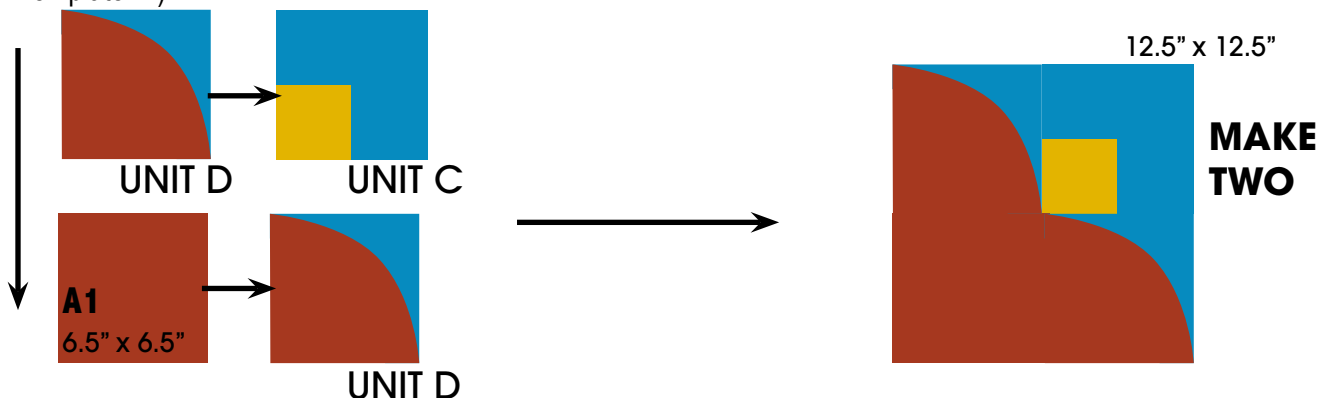
All seam allowances are 1/4". All seams are pressed to one side unless otherwise noted.



Using the cuts of fabric shown, connect the two squares to one another, then stitch the resulting unit to the rectangle. Press seam allowances open. This is UNIT C.



Using the pieces cut from Template A and Template B, stitch the curved seam. This is a very gentle curve, and should come together fairly easily--begin by finger pressing each cut template in half to mark center (shown by dotted lines), then match the center of Template A to the center of Template B; pin in place. Continue pinning along the entire curve, matching the corners and keeping them squared to one another. Stitch and the press seam allowances toward the Template B. This is UNIT D. (If necessary, trim to size, taking care to leave 1/4" seam allowance along straight edges of Template B.)



Attach one Unit D to one Unit C as shown. Press seam allowances toward Unit C. Then, attach one square of A1 to one of Unit D, as shown. Press seam allowances toward the square. Finally, assemble the block by nesting seams and stitching. Press these seam allowances open.



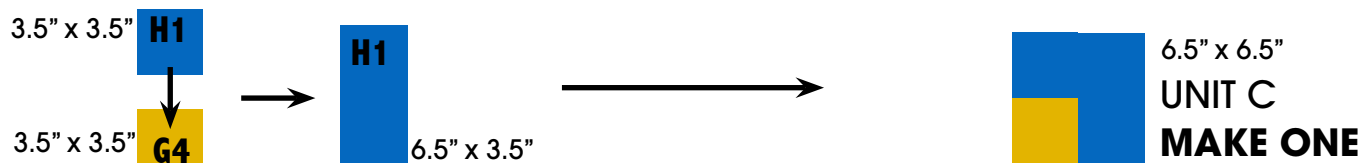
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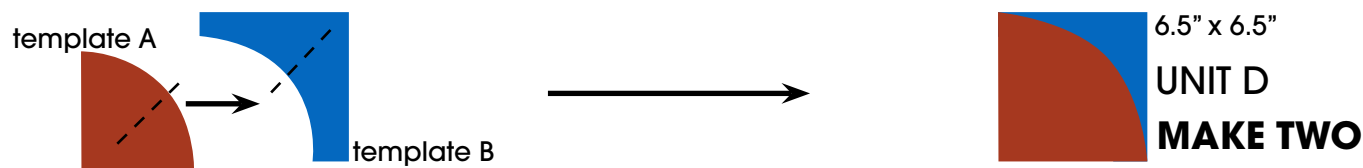
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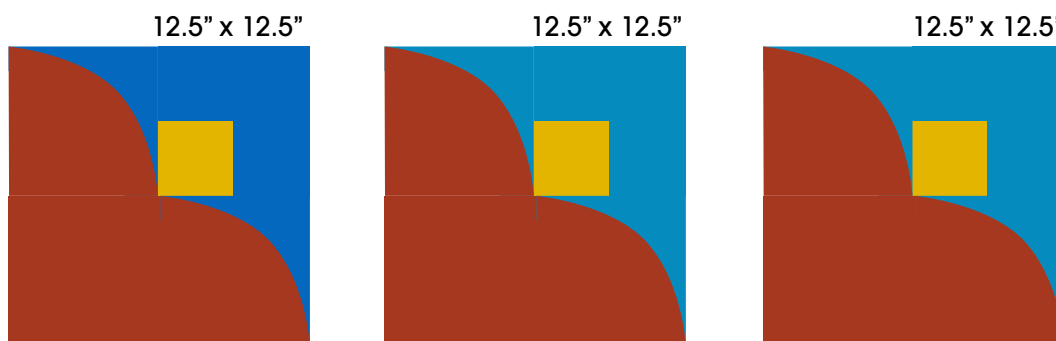
Repeat the steps above with H1. The instructions are duplicated below for your convenience.



Using the cuts of fabric shown, connect the two squares to one another, then stitch the resulting unit to the rectangle. Press seam allowances open. This is UNIT C.



Using the pieces cut from Template A and Template B, stitch the curved seam. This is a very gentle curve, and should come together fairly easily--begin by finger pressing each cut template in half to mark center (shown by dotted lines), then match the center of Template A to the center of Template B; pin in place. Continue pinning along the entire curve, matching the corners and keeping them squared to one another. Stitch and the press seam allowances toward the Template B. This is UNIT D. (If necessary, trim to size, taking care to leave 1/4" seam allowance along straight edges of Template B.)
